



**Coach David Underwood**

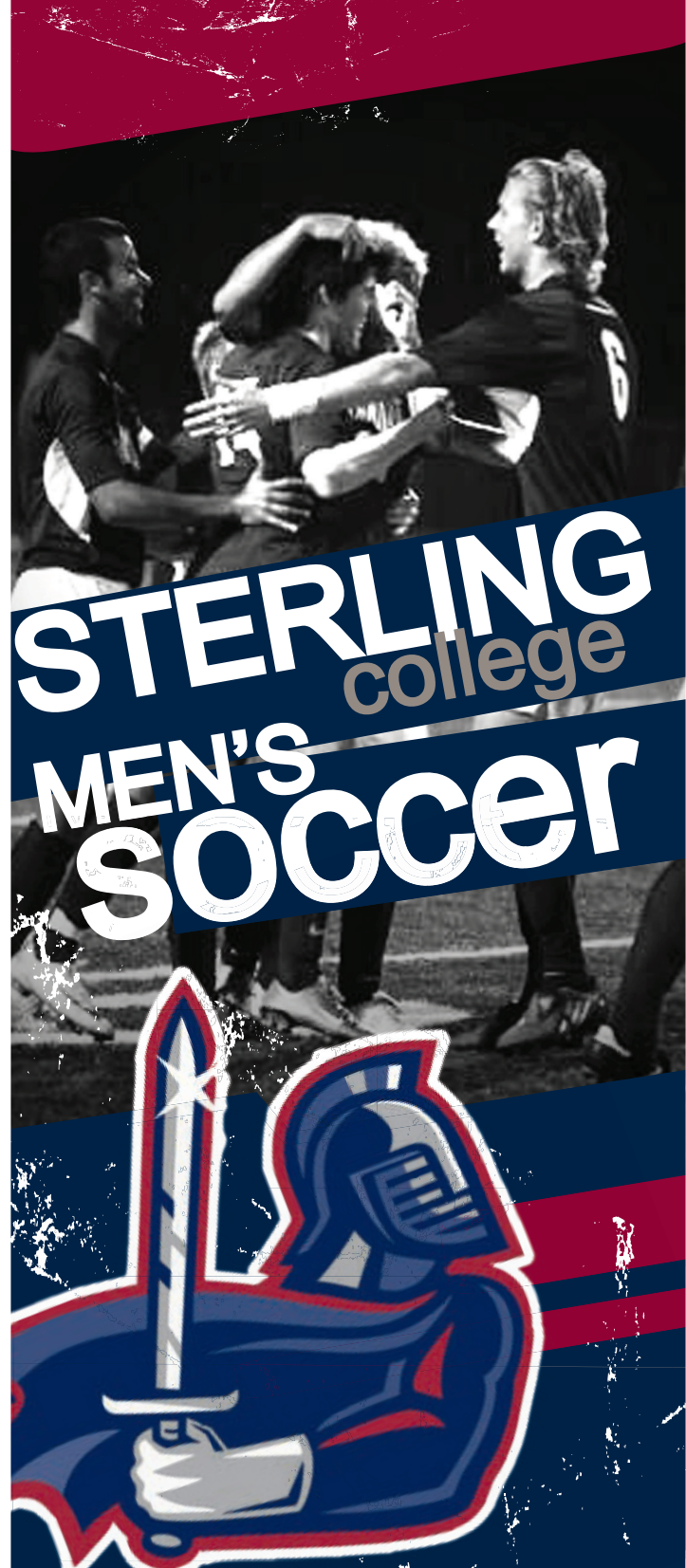
