POSITIONS

Sterling College has an ongoing need for adjunct faculty to teach classes either online or on campus in the following areas: Sociology (Online), Business, Education, History, Mathematics and Theology & Ministry. There is a particular need for sociology (online) for Spring Semester 2011.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Teach assigned courses.
- Practice integration of Christian perspective within all aspects of the discipline.

QUALIFICATIONS

All SC employees are expected to demonstrate a strong and articulate Christian faith, to model and mentor students in servant leadership and in the integration of faith into every aspect of life and learning. Specific requirements for this position include:

- Master's degree or higher from an accredited institution, with at least 18 graduate hours in the discipline.
- College teaching experience that demonstrates an understanding of the teaching/learning process preferred.
- An understanding of undergraduate college students and an ability to relate well to them.
