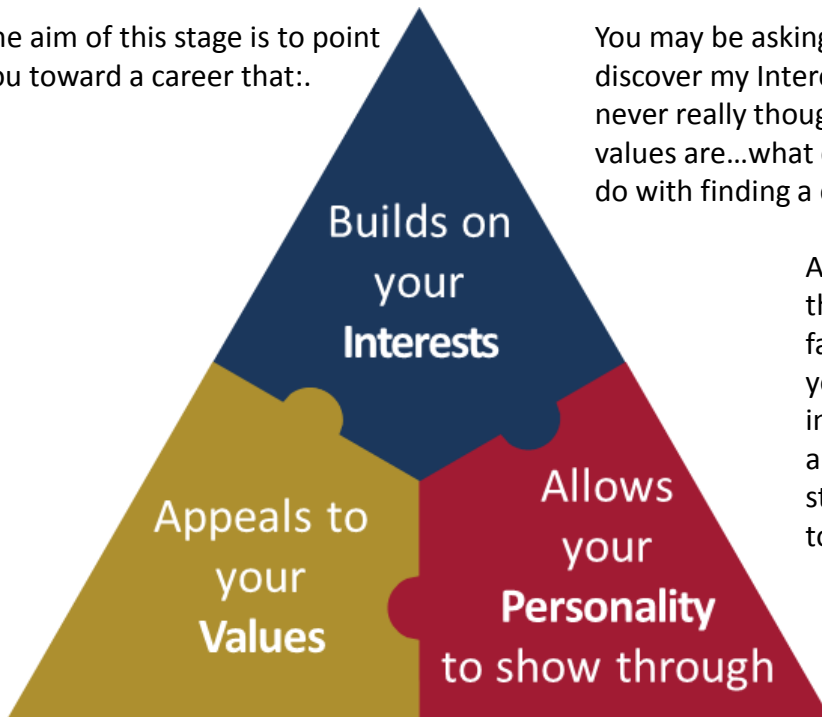


## CONDUCT YOUR ASSESSMENT OVERVIEW

Discovering who God created you to be will help you determine what He created you to do. You want to choose an occupation that fits who you are. Knowing what it is that makes you uniquely you is not always easy, that's where the first stage in our Career Planning Process, **Conduct Your Assessment**, fits in.



The aim of this stage is to point you toward a career that:



You may be asking: “How do I discover my Interests?”, or “I’ve never really thought about what my values are...what does that have to do with finding a career?”

An assessment can be the result of the conversations you have with family and/or friends. They know you well. What do they see as your interests? It can be difficult to answer questions like these in this stage on your own because we tend to develop our own blind spots.

Another, more formal, type of assessment is to use paper or online tools. There are literally hundreds of assessments you could take that are intended to help you identify potential careers.
